MSA OFFROAD MOTORCYCLES / QUADS NATIONAL CIRCULAR 01 OF 2016

Please see below amendments to the 2016 National Offroad Motorcycles / Quads Standing Supplementary Regulations:

SSR 321

For a championship to be declared there must be *minimum of 10 starters* per national class calculated over the total number of rounds in the championship need to participate. *This requirement needs to be achieved at not less than 80% of the events run (i.e. 5 of 6 scheduled rounds).*

The National off-road championship will comprise of *Five (5)* events with *all* results to count towards the Championship.

Competitors may only score in one national or Silver Inter Provincial challenge class at an event.

a) MOTORCYCLES

- i) To declare South African Off Road Motorcycle National Champions in the **85cc Senior**, OR1 **(Open)**, OR2 **(250cc)**, OR3 **(200cc)**, **Class D (125cc)**, Senior, Master, Ladies and High School Classes.
- iii) To announce winners in the Silver *Inter Provincial* Challenge *class and Class D*. Silver Challenge winners may not re-compete in the class, and winners of the previous year's Silver *Inter Provincial* Challenge *Class* will be entitled to free entries in a National class in the next year.

b) **QUADS**

To declare South African Quad Champions in the Q *Open, QLadies, and QMasters, and High School* Classes.

c) LADIES

- i) To declare South African Ladies champion in the combined ladies motorcycle and ladies quad class.
- ii) Scoring of the Ladies championship class will be done by using a handicap factor between the motorcycle and quad results.
- iii) The handicap will be calculated as follows: The top riders after 1 lap (not ladies) times in the motorcycles and quads will be used. Taking these two times, the slower time will then be divided into the faster time giving a factor. This factor will then be applied to the ladies motorcycle or quad times of the slowest category in the overall (not ladies) times of the day.

- c) All competitors at Senior national and regional level are eligible to compete in the year of their **14**th birthday.
- d) Competitors under the age of 18 years will be restricted to the following classes / machine capacities at all events (except for the 85cc Senior Class)

SSR 326

The maximum entry fees for National events are *R1300.00* exclusive of *VAT*, including all levies and *Timing services* charges. For National events; the late entry fee will be an additional *R200* exclusive of *VAT*.

SSR330

d) Q Open: 1 - 9

i) National and Regional competitors may pre-book a number from 21 upwards as from 01 December 2015 only provided that payment for the 2016 licence is paid in full.

SSR 331

b) OR3 (200cc) Class:

Two stroke motorcycles with an engine capacity not exceeding 201cc and four stroke motorcycles with an engine capacity not exceeding 251cc. *Open to competitors from the year of their 16th birthday and older. Read in conjunction with SSR 325(d).*

c) OR2 *(250cc)* Class:

Two stroke motorcycles with an engine capacity greater than 201 cc but not exceeding 251cc and four stroke motorcycles with an engine capacity greater than 251 cc but not exceeding 401cc. *Refer SSR* 325(d) for competitors up to and including the year of their 18th birthday.

d) OR1 (Open) Class:

Two stroke motorcycles with an engine capacity in excess of 251cc and four stroke motorcycles with an engine capacity in excess of 401cc. *Refer SSR 325(d) for competitors up to and including the year of their 18th birthday.*

h) High School Class

Open to competitors from the year of their 14th birthday, to 31 December of the year in which their 17th birthday occurs and restricted to motorcycles with an engine capacity not exceeding 201cc two stroke or four stroke with an engine capacity not exceeding 251cc. Read in conjunction with SSR 325(d).

j) Ladies Combined Championship Class:

Any capacity Bike. Open to competitors from the year of their 16th birthday and older. Refer SSR 325(d) for competitors up to and including the year of their 18th birthday.

SSR 332

a) Quad (Open) Class:

Open to competitors from the year of their 18th birthday and older. Any Engine capacity allowed. Refer SSR 325(d) for competitors up to and including the year of their 18th birthday.

b) Q2 Class:

Open to competitors from the year of their 19th birthday. Any capacity quad may be used larger than 450cc. Read in conjunction with SSR 325(d).

b) Ladies Combined Championship Class:

Any capacity quad. Open to competitors from the year of their 16th birthday and older. Refer SSR 325(d) for competitors up to and including the year of their 18th birthday.

c) QMaster Class:

Open to competitors from the year of their 38th birthday and older. Any capacity quad may be used.

d) High School Class

Open to competitors from the year of their 14th birthday, to 31 December of the year in which their 17th birthday occurs and restricted to quads with an engine capacity not exceeding 300cc two stroke or four stroke with an engine capacity not exceeding 451cc. Read in conjunction with SSR 325(d)

SSR 338

a) All National Championship events will:

- i) Comprise of Racing Section 1 and Racing Section 2 aggregated. The route will consist of 2 or 3 loops of 100 – 150 km.
- ii) Bikes and Quads will start on separate times as stipulated in the event SR's.
- iii) Racing Section 1 (Time Trial) which will be between 40-50 km.
- iv) Racing Section 2 will be between 300 350km:
 - 1. Bikes OR1 300 350km
 - 2. Bikes OR2 300 350km
 - 3. Bikes OR3 300 350km
 - 4. Bikes Class D 150 200km
 - 5. Bikes Senior 300 350km
 - 6. Bikes Master 300 350km
 - 7. Bikes Ladies 300 350km
 - 8. Bikes Silver 150 200km
 - 9. Bikes High School 300 350km
 - 10. 85cc Senior 40 50 km
 - 11. Quads Open 300 350km
 - 12. Quads Ladies 300 350km
 - 13. Quads Silver 150- 200km
 - 14. Quads Master 300 350km
 - 15. Quads High School 300 350km
