SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS

1. TITLE AND STATUS:

The gymkhana takes place on, Saturday, 16 November 2019 at the turn 5 area of Killarney. Invitation is extended to all clubs to participate, but in order to score towards the Witzenberg Motorklub Gymkhana Championship you will be expected to be a member of the club. This event is a double header comprising of Rounds 5 and 6 of the 2019 championship.

2. JURISDICTION:

Held under the International Sporting Code of the FIA, General Competition Rules (GCR's), the Standing Supplementary Regulations (SSR's) of Motorsport South Africa (MSA) and these Supplementary Regulations (SR's) together with Western Cape Special Stage Rally Regulations (161702/144) and the 2019 Witzenberg Motor Club Gymkhana Series Regulations (161840/144).

7. **DESCRIPTION:**

The event is designed for a maximum entry of 30 cars (single format). Pre event entry would allow the organisers the opportunity to slot cars against similar opposition based either on performance records or engine capacity. Final decision rests with the Clerk of the Course and his Assistant.

NO PRACTICE RUN will be allowed!

Four runs including penalties will be required for classification as a finisher and the fastest two times including penalties will be combined for an overall result. Should weather or accidents delay the proceedings a minimum of two runs will be scored. Drivers briefing at 08h40

Entrance to Killarney for competitors and officials will be via the main gate. Final arrangements will be sent via WhatsApp group Officials. Please ensure that the organisers have your correct cell number.

You will not be able to leave the pits to warm up tyres. Once in you stay in the pit area to alleviate congestion.

8. **DOCUMENTATION:**

Documentation will take place at Killarney turn 5 area and will be open from 07h00 to 08:30 for round 5 competitors and from 13h00 until 13h30 for round 6 competitors. Only those who have made prior arrangements with either Pierre van der Westhuizen or Abdul Sayed will be considered as exceptions. Entries limited to 30. Entry forms for each round has to be filled in separately.

9. SCRUTINEERING:

From 07h00 until 08h30 for round 5 and from 13h00 until 13h30 for round 6. Exceptions will be those who made prior arrangements. No car will start official runs without completing documentation and scrutiny. Scrutineering will take place in the Killarney turn 5 area. Please line up as soon as you have completed documentation.

The following will be checked by the scrutineers:

- A Sponsor decals and number affixed to the car
- B Brakes and Steering Mechanism
- C Rims -Tyres Nuts
- D Safety Belts
- E Helmets are not Mandatory but Recommended!
- F General Roadworthy Condition

<u>Notice to Entrant</u>: Should any work be carried out on the vehicle after scrutineering had been completed the onus rests with the entrant to have the car re-scrutineered whenever such work could influence the safety of said vehicle. Failure to do so will make the entrant responsible should failure of altered / changed component lead to damage of property or injury to either competitor / official or spectator. Refer to GCR 254 and 255 of 2019 MSA Handbook.

10. START:

The first car will start at 09h00 (round 5) and approximately 14h00 (round 6) and each car has to complete the set course (which is the same for both rounds 5 and 6) before the next car can start. Four scoring runs are planned with a full 30 entries. Less entries could allow more runs. Announcements will be made throughout the day.

Start Sequence: The Jayen MkII timer / starting robot will be similar to that currently being used for the start of each FIA Formula One Grand Prix. Five red lights will flash on at one second intervals and on the sixth second all five will go out, signalling the start. Lanes will be synchronised and controlled by the chief marshal. Jump start penalties will apply. *Familiarize yourself with the system before the event starts*.

Start Notice: Standing start will be utilized throughout the event and this relates to a stationary vehicle when under starters orders. Once the first red light comes on the vehicle is to remain stationary until all five lights go out. Should a vehicle require a push start it may only commence after the timing sequence had been completed. Start Marshal ruling will be final.

Finish Notice: For reasons of safety teams will come to a complete stop, straddling (front wheels in front and rear wheels behind the line) the finish line on each and every run - practice and / or official. Failure to do so will result in a ten second penalty. Finish Marshal (Judge of Fact) ruling will be final and cannot be protested. A red/white finish line will be painted across the road with road marking paint.

11. START / FINISH:

Start / Finish will be at the Killarney turn 5 area. Upon finishing it is requested that the podium finishers present themselves with their cars in front of the commentators for a photograph.

12. MEDICAL PLAN:

Medical plan in accordance with MSA requirements.

13. RESULTS AND PRIZEGIVING:

A complete set of results will be posted at the Marshals Club House as soon as possible after the last car had completed its final run and will become final after 15 minutes, after which the prize giving will commence.

14. ENTRY FEE:

Entry fee for all classes will be as follows:

1 entry (4 runs) R250 2 entries (8 runs) R400 3 or more entries (12 runs or more) R600

Non WBMK members + R100 to the above

Discount for non WBMK members R300 per entry (if you enter both

events) otherwise as above

NO ENTRIES will be accepted on the day

Entries close on Wednesday, 13 November 2019 at midnight. Final decision rests with the COC.

Each driver to take out minimum of a One Event MSA Social Competition Licence. Licences must be taken out on line via the MSA licencing system.

NO LICENCES TO BE SOLD ON THE DAY

A COPY OF THE LICENCE TO BE BROUGHT TO DOCUMENTATION

Navigators who will not be driving will only be required to complete an MSA Indemnity at **no cost.**

Time that your entry is received by fax or email will determine classification. Should more than 30 entries be received a reserve list will be distributed to the teams affected.

Notice: Submitting an entry form will represent full intent to compete and failure to withdraw entry at least 24 hours before the 10h00 start will have said team forfeit their entry fee.

Important Notice: Insurance Cover MSA

Public liability cover is R50,000,000.00 with excess of R25000.00 payable by the entrant. Cover applies only while competing on the event as per MSA policy. Competitors enter and compete at their own risk. The organising clubs, officials decline liability in any incident / accident caused by or to competitors and their vehicles during the whole event. Entrants, competitors will have no claim against the organisers or landowners of private property arising out of the act or default of or by them, their servants or officials before, during or after the gymkhana.

15. ELIGIBILITY OF CREWS:

All drivers to be in possession of minimum MSA Social Competition Licence for cars.

Note: In order to score points every crew must consist of a driver and a navigator. Drivers and navigators may swop seats in the same car. A team (same driver and navigator) may enter more than once and be displayed in final result but only their first (lowest number entered) run can be nominated to score towards the Final Result (trophies). A driver is allowed to swop navigators only for non scoring runs. Navigators have to be a minimum of 10 years old.

16. PROTECTIVE CLOTHING:

- 16.1 All competitors (drivers and navigators) will be permitted to participate provided that they have the appropriate safety gear that will consist of long sleeve top, long pants and closed shoes.
- 16.2 Helmets are recommended but not mandatory.

17. CLASSES:

- A Front Wheel Drive Cars 1851cc and above
- B Front Wheel Drive Cars 1651cc to 1850cc
- C Front Wheel Drive Cars 1451cc to 1650cc
- D Front Wheel Drive Cars up to 1450cc
- E Rear Wheel Drive Cars 2001cc and above
- F Rear Wheel Drive Cars up to 2000cc
- G Specials: 4x4 –Turbo Supercharged Mid Engined
- H Single Seaters including Karts (helmets compulsory for open single seaters)
- I Ladies Class
- M Invited guests
- J Big Wheel Class -2×4 and 4×4 Tyre size 31x 10.5 x 15 or 265x75x16 and bigger

The Clerk of the Course reserves the right to use his discretion regarding vehicle classification.

18. SCORING:

- 18.1 Electronic Infra-red / Laser timing triggered by the chief marshal with minimum of one handheld stopwatch as back-up on each run. Penalties to be awarded in accordance with Judges of Fact reports.
- 18.2 Two runs to be classified as a finisher. Fastest 2 times combined.
- 18.3 Organisers reserve the right to increase / decrease amount of qualifying runs.

19. CLASSIFICATION:

In order to qualify as a finisher *all the runs have to be completed* as per final instruction.

20. JUDGES OF FACT:

Start and Finish Marshals will be Judges of Fact in respect of jump starts and straddle stops. Judges of Fact on the route to be confirmed in Final Instructions.

21. PENALTIES: (REFER GYMKHANA REGULATIONS)

Slowest time plus 10 second will be awarded for deliberate short-cutting OR DEVIATION from set course (where team obviously benefits from wrong slot). 10 Second penalty for each obstacle missed, entered from wrong direction, passed or failure to straddle line (two wheels in front and two behind) and touching or knocking over of bollards. *Play if you want but stick to the set route at all times*.

Penalties will also be applied for starting out of sequence. Written permission from CoC to be submitted with the scorers to avoid penalties. Hands protruding from vehicles during runs will also be penalised by 10 seconds. *Defending champion will start as car No 1*.

NB: Misconduct (littering – racing on access roads – excessive noise – damage to property) by any team and its associates will result in the disqualification of the respective crews and an official complaint will be lodged with both MSA and the members specific Club. Clerk of the Course will have the final discretion.

22. PRIZEGIVING:

23. <u>DEMO RUNS:</u>

The organisers reserve the right to create the opportunity for selected individuals to accompany nominated drivers on non scoring promotional runs through the set course. These promotional runs will be announced near the end of the day and quantity will depend on weather and time available. These individuals will have to sign an indemnity form.

24. Six children organised by Reach for a Dream or the like may be taken for one drive each.

Notice to competitors:

General Competition Rule 255: The Clerk of the Course may exclude any vehicle, the construction of which he or the scrutineers deem to be dangerous, or which has suffered damage during a competition making further participation dangerous.

General Competition Rule 254: (Shortened) All competing and reserve vehicles must be visually examined in the paddock or prescribed scrutineering area prior to the event for safety and general compliance with the group, category or class entered. In any event, the Clerk of the Course, the Stewards of the Meeting and/or MSA management, have the power to order the examination of any vehicle at their discretion.

iii) It is a condition of entering a vehicle for a competition that the entrant/drive/rider shall indemnify the scrutineers or other technical officials against any claim for damage to, or loss of, a vehicle or component thereof providing that reasonable care is exercised by the scrutineers whilst the vehicle / component is in their possession.
