NEW FIA 2018 ANTI-ALCOHOL REGULATIONS

Alcohol testing is essential to safety in motor sport.

As it is no longer a doping prohibited substance, there was a necessity and an opportunity for the FIA to create its own alcohol testing system.

The World Motor Sport Council has adopted anti-alcohol regulations (Appendix C to the International Sporting Code) in March 2018.

- WHAT IS THE SCOPE OF THE REGULATIONS?

- The presence of alcohol in a driver's body during an International Competition is prohibited.
- The FIA and/or the Stewards on site can require a testing (random or targeted).

- WHAT ARE THE SANCTIONS?

- Immediate disqualification from the race:
- A fixed scale of additional sanctions (See reverse side).

- WHAT ARE THE CONTROL PROCEEDINGS?

- The FIA will provide and maintain the equipment:
- · One breathalyser for the initial test;
- Another breathalyser for the confirmation test (to be carried out in case the initial test is above o mg/L, taking into account the margin of error of the breathalysers);
- Waivers regarding specific medical conditions such as endogenous ethanol production can be requested.
- Alcohol testing will be performed by the Chief Medical Officers who will receive specific documentation.
- Testing period:
- 3 hours before race/qualification/ test
- until 30 min after race/ qualification/test (specific procedure in case of podium ceremony).
