Judas saith to him, not the Iscariot: Lord, how is it, that thou wilt manifest thyself to us, and not to the world? Jesus answered, and said to him: If any one love me, he will keep my word, and my Father will love him, and we will come to him, and will make our abode with him. He

that loveth me not, keepeth not my words. And the word which you have heard, is not mine; but the Father’s who sent me. These things have I spoken to you, abiding with you. But the Paraclete, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, he will teach you all things, and bring all things to your mind, whatsoever I shall have said to you.” (John 14:21–26)

Evil spirits bring the opposite...


Confusion, ignorance, bad judgement, faint heartedness, spiritual blindness, rebellion, fear of evil, selfishness, anxiety, depression, restlessness, insomnia, impatience, greed, deceitfulness, nastiness, laziness, anger, aggressiveness, doubt, pride, vanity, addictions, lust...

You will know them by their fruits – be careful of false tongues

“And these signs shall follow them that believe: In my name they shall cast out devils: they shall speak with new tongues. They shall take up serpents; and if they shall drink any deadly thing, it shall not hurt them: they shall lay their hands upon the sick, and they shall recover.” (Matthew 16:17–18)

“Yes, my people must be aware of the dangers of the entrapment of tongues, the messages given without my children’s comprehension. Yes, my daughter _____, she is in a dark place, but prayers are a balm to my Sacred Heart. My daughter _____ needs more teachings about how to receive and how to proceed with zeal and practise the right path for my children’s lives. You will be my fortress to help them. “Modesty”, “longanimity”, and “chastity” have been removed as fruits of the Holy Spirit – others modified

*“Fructus autem Spiritus est **caritas**, gaudium, pax, patientia, benignitas, bonitas, **longanimitas**, mansuetudo, **fides**, **modestia**, continentia, **castitas**. Adversus hujusmodi non est lex.”* (Galatians 5:22–23)

- DR: “But the fruit of the Spirit is, charity, joy, peace, **patience**, benignity [kindness], **goodness**, **longanimity**, mildness, **faith**, **modesty**, **continency**, **chastity**. Against such there is no law.”
- NIV: “But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, **goodness**, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. Against such things there is no law.”
- NABRE: “In contrast, the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, **patience**, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control. Against such there is no law.”

[charity = sacrificial love; longanimity = Long suffering; mildness = gentleness; faith = having faith in God; continency = self-restraint, celibacy, abstinence]

The Holy Spirit, the Paraclete, is God our Comforter, not our Advocate to the Father: Jesus is our Advocate who pleads to the Father. Mother Mary is our Most Gracious Advocate who pleads to her Son Jesus on our behalf

*“et ego rogabo Patrem, et alium **Paraclitum** dabit vobis, ut maneat vobiscum in aeternum”*
(John 14:16)

- DR: “And I will ask the Father, and he shall give you another **Paraclete**, that he may abide with you for ever.”
- NIV: “And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another advocate to help you and be with you forever”
- NABRE: “And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Advocate to be with you always”

“Paraclitum” means our “comforter, helper, guidance”.

In 1 John 2:1 it says, “we have an advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the just”, coming from the Latin word *“advocatum”*

Mercy, faith, purging of sins and God's call to obedience have been removed

*“Conturbat domum suam qui sectatur avaritiam; qui autem odit munera vivet. **Per misericordiam et fidem purgantur peccata, per timorem autem Domini declinat omnis a malo. Mens justi meditatur obedientiam; os impiorum redundat malis.**”* (Proverbs 15:27–28)

- DR: “He that is greedy of gain troubleth his own house: but he that hateth bribes shall live. **By mercy and faith sins are purged away: and by the fear of the Lord every one declineth from evil. The mind of the just studieth obedience:** the mouth of the wicked over floweth with evils.”
- NIV: “The greedy bring ruin to their households, but the one who hates bribes will live. The heart of the righteous weighs its answers, but the mouth of the wicked gushes evil.”
- NABRE: “The greedy tear down their own house, but those who hate bribes will live. The heart of the just ponders a response, but the mouth of the wicked spews evil.”
