



REGULATIONS AND SPECIFICATIONS FOR THE 2020 BRIDGESTONE SUPERBIKES NATIONAL CHALLENGE SERIES (162072)

1. Format:

The Bridgestone SuperBikes National Challenge Series is aimed at experienced and expert riders and it is intended as the premier motorcycle category on the tour on which it runs.

2. Controlled Tyres:

All riders will be required to race on the series sponsor (Bridgestone) tyres. The R11, R10 & VO2 variants will be the only permissible options available to each rider. The preferred tyre supplier to the series is Industry Motorcycles (represented by Ruperd Fourie – contact details at the end of this document), from whom tyres can be pre-ordered and who shall provide a tyre fitment service at the tracks.

3. Eligibility of Motorcycle:

Prospective competitors must ensure that the motorcycle entered for any event, must comply with the following rules as listed below:

- 3.1 600cc and larger capacity motorcycles are permitted to take part.
- 3.2 Front brake pads and calipers must be lock-wired at all times.
- 3.3 Full face helmets with double D-ring fasteners, full leathers, armor protective gloves and ankle protecting boots, all in good condition, must be worn at all times.
- 3.4 No anti-freeze will be allowed in the radiator.
- 3.5 The Bridgestone Superbikes committee’s decision regarding tyres is final.
- 3.6 The use of tyre warmers is permitted.
- 3.7 Modifications – Unless specified otherwise there is no restriction on any performance modifications that may be done on the motorcycle - exhaust, air filter, suspension, tuning, etc.
- 3.8 Competitors may not fit turbo chargers, super-chargers or Nitrous Oxide boosting
- 3.9 Headlights, tail lights, brake lights, indicators, mirrors, etc. must be removed.
- 3.10 Side and/or centre stands must be removed.
- 3.11 Oil filler cap, sump plugs and oil filter must be locked wired at all times whilst racing.
- 3.12 All competitors are required to display the series sponsor’s stickers on their motorcycle. Refusal or failure to display the required stickers in the specified positions will result in offenders being excluded from competition.

4. Eligibility of Rider:

Riders must hold a current circuit motorcycle regional MSA licence. A rider younger than 16 – refer SSR 1 - may apply to the committee who (in conjunction with MSA) will decide if the rider is eligible.

5. Classes:

- 5.1 The committee will decide in which class a rider will race. A new rider will be allocated to a class after Race 1. This will be based on his/her best lap time in qualifying and Race 1.
- 5.2 The class times are as follows:

Zwartkops	
Class	Time
A From	01:03.99 And below

B From	01:04.00
To	01:05.99

Ladies class – All lady riders	
Masters class – All riders born before 01 January 1975	

The lap times for each class at non-Zwartkops events will be determined by the committee and communicated to the riders before qualifying at the event. If a rider exceeds the class lap time point 5.5 applies.

Riders in the Ladies and Masters classes will score points in these classes as well as classes A-B. Only points scored in classes A-B will count towards the overall series.

- 5.3 If a rider changes motorcycle to a different make or cubic capacity and/or significantly modifies his/her existing motorcycle (the committee's decision is final), then the rider will be re-classed based on the lap times achieved as per rule 5.1. The onus is on the rider to inform the committee if he/she has changed motorcycle or significantly modified his/her existing motorcycle.
- 5.4 If a new rider joins Bridgestone Superbikes at a non-Zwartkops event the committee will allocate the rider to a class based on the lap times achieved by the new rider in qualifying and race 1. (Allocation only after race 1).
- 5.5 A class change to a higher class will take place at the next event (unless point 5.6 applies), if during the same season a rider breaks his/her class time by lapping faster in **any two different sessions** (qualifying, race 1 and race 2 are defined as sessions). If a rider exceeds the class lap times in at least 4 laps in a session, then the rider will automatically move to a higher class at the next event (unless clause 5.6 applies).
- 5.6 If a rider breaks his/her class time after the 4th event of the season (and provided the rider does not change motorcycle), the rider will not move up to the higher class and will remain in his/her class for the remainder of the season. Example – A rider has competed in events 1 through 4 and at the 5th event this rider breaks his/her class time, rule 5.6 will apply and this rider will not move up a class.
- 5.7 A rider may apply in writing to the Bridgestone Superbikes Committee to be re-classed if the rider has changed to a smaller capacity motorcycle and/or a different make of motorcycle. The committee's decision is final.
- 5.8 Lap times achieved in Bridgestone Challenge and Bridgestone Superbikes will be taken into account for Bridgestone Superbikes class allocation.
- 5.9 Official Lap times from any other series/ club race will be taken into account to move a new rider into another class, should the rider be found quicker than he/she is in their current class. The committee's decision is final.

6. Scoring:

- 6.1 Points will be scored per race and separately in each class. The points will be scored per class as follows:

1 st – 25 points	6 th – 10 points	11 th – 5 points
2 nd – 20 points	7 th – 9 points	12 th – 4 points
3 rd – 16 points	8 th – 8 points	13 th – 3 points
4 th – 13 points	9 th – 7 points	14 th – 2 points
5 th – 11 points	10 th – 6 points	15 th – 1 point

If there are three or less competitors in a class then points will be scored as follows:

Only 50% of original points table.

6.2 A rider must be classified as a finisher on the results in order to score points.

6.3 If a rider changes class then based on the below table he/she will carry the specified percentage of points (rounded to the nearest point) to the higher class.

Event	Points percentage carried
After the first event	100%
2 nd Event	90%
3 rd Event	80%
4 th Event	70%

Example: A rider usually competes in class B but breaks into class A (per point 5.5) at the third event. This rider will carry 80% of his/her points into class A.

6.4 Points will be awarded to the first 15 finishers at an event towards the overall championship per race.
Example: A rider finished race one 1st and race two 3rd his total points towards the overall championship will be
15+13 = 28 for the event.

1 st – 15 points	6 th – 10 points	11 th – 5 points
2 nd – 14 points	7 th – 9 points	12 th – 4 points
3 rd – 13 points	8 th – 8 points	13 th – 3 points
4 th – 12 points	9 th – 7 points	14 th – 2 points
5 th – 11 points	10 th – 6 points	15 th – 1 point

6.5 All races (even non-Zwartkops races) score points and count towards the championship.

6.6 A rider may elect to not score points. The points will then be scored as if the rider did not compete in the championship.
This is for a rider joining for one or two races who doesn't want to affect the series points, and is only there to have fun. The rider needs to put this in writing before Race 1.

6.7 Riders that join Bridgestone Superbikes from Bridgestone Challenge may carry overall and class points into the Bridgestone Superbikes championship as per rule 6.3 (overall and class points will carry but with the reduced percentage as per rule 6.3).

6.8 Riders that join the series at the 7th event or later, will be classed as per the rules and will be eligible for trophies however these riders will not score points towards the championship. The points will be scored as if these riders had not participated.

7. Starting order:

Race 1 – best lap in qualifying

Race 2 – race one finishing order

7.1 If there are exceptional circumstances (such as extreme weather), the committee may elect for the competitors to start in class in championship order.

8. Trophies:

Although points will be scored on a per race basis, trophies are awarded on the combined race times of race 1 and race 2 (and race 3 in the event that there are three races on a day). Trophies will be awarded at the discretion of the promoters. Ladies and Masters Class will ONLY have 1st overall trophies for both on the day and the year as they take part in the classes already. Riders are urged to enter early for each race before trophies are ordered. The number of trophies will be dependent on the number of riders entered.

9. Special Guest Riders:

Special guest riders (with higher than regional status licences) may be allowed to take part in specific events with the permission of the committee and MSA.
