

2020 KWAZULU-NATAL REGIONAL MOTOCROSS CHAMPIONSHIP REGULATIONS AND SPECIFICATIONS

(162129/134)

Note: These regulations are to be read in conjunction with the General Competition Rules (GCR's), *National Motocross* Standing Supplementary Regulations (SSR's) and any applicable circulars of Motorsport South Africa (MSA). These regulations must be read and understood by all competitors.

In the event that there is any conflict between regional and national rules, the national rules (2020 MSA SA National Motocross SSR's) shall, at all times prevail.

1. VALIDITY OF THE REGULATIONS

Applicable for the calendar year of 2020.

2. CONTROLLER OF THE CHAMPIONSHIP

The Controllers of the Championship will be the MSA KwaZulu-Natal Regional Motorsport Committee.

3. AIM OF THE CHAMPIONSHIP

To declare a KwaZulu-Natal Motocross Champion in each *of the Regional* classes. The Controllers are responsible for declaring the winners of the Championship and are entitled to withhold such declaration from any competitor. The Championship year shall run from 1 January *2020* to 31 December *2020*. AVERAGE OF 6 RIDERS PER CLASS TO CONSTITUTE A CHAMPIONSHIP as per SR 6.3.

KwaZulu-Natal Championship Classes:

- 50cc Auto Clutch (Air & Water Cooled)
- 65cc
- 85cc
- MX3
- Premier Class A

Regional Colours are at the discretion of Motorsport South Africa and are not automatically awarded to all winners. Regional Colours are awarded as per the Regional Colours Criteria.

4. <u>ELIGIBILITY OF RIDERS & MOTORCYCLES</u>

The Championship is open to all riders who are domiciled in the area under jurisdiction of the MSA KwaZulu-Natal and Northern Regions Motorsport Committees, as permitted in GCR 60.

All eligible riders, motorcycles and licences comply with SR 16.

5. CHAMPIONSHIP EVENTS AND HEATS TO COUNT

- 5.1 Six events with two heats per class per Regional are scheduled totalling 12 heats for the championship.
- 5.2 A minimum of 10 heats to count to qualify as a championship (force majeure) should an event be cancelled.
- 5.3 All competitors who enter & compete in the last event of the Championship, will get 10 bonus points towards their respective championship.

6. CLASSES AND POINT SCORING

- 6.1 All entries MUST appear on all result sheets, even if a rider does not start the 1st heat or does not complete racing for the day. All competitors must compete in practice and at least one heat to be countered as a starter.
- 6.2 Manual scoring will be utilized; however, transponders may be used by organisers at their own expense.
- 6.3 There shall be an average of 6 starters over the 6 events for classes to score points towards the Championship.
- **6.4** Points scoring will be in accordance with the **2020** SA MSA National Motocross SSR's.
- 6.5 Championship scoring will be available on the MSA website (<u>www.motorsport.co.za</u> / 011 675 2220)
- 6.6 Classes and Technical Specifications as listed below in SR 16.

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7. SEPARATION OF TIES

In the case of a tie at the end of the series, the competitor with the greatest number of firsts will be champion. If this does not resolve the tie, the greatest number of seconds will count, failing this, thirds and so on. If a tie still remains, performance in all championship events will be taken into consideration and if this is still ineffective, MSA shall declare the winner on such a basis as it deems fit.

8. COMPETITION NUMBERS

Competition numbers for ALL classes will be those as issued by Motorsport SA (Head Office) only. Refer to SSR 221 – 224 in the **2020** MSA SA National Motocross SSR's.

9. PROGRAMME OF EVENTS, RACE DISTANCE AND RACE ORDER

Refer to SR's (Event regulations).

RACE DISTANCE & RACE ORDER (The duration and race order of the event may be altered if deemed necessary by the Clerk of the Course in consultation with the Stewards.)

10. SCRUTINEERING

- 10.1 Self-Scrutineering will apply. Forms will be available at event documentation.
- 10.2 Refer to SSR 226 in **2020** MSA SA National Motocross SSR's.

11. MULTIPLE CLASSES

Multiple classes are permitted, provided the rider's age and motorcycle conforms.

12. CLOSURE OF CIRCUIT

- 12.1 The closure of the circuit prior to Regional Championship events will be advised in the SR's.
- 12.2 The responsibility for establishing if a circuit is open lies with competitors.

13. TROPHIES & PRIZEMONEY

At the discretion of the promoters / organisers.

14. ENTRIES

Entry fees for 2020 can be seen in the SR's.

15. FIRE EXTINGUISHER, ENVIRONMENTAL MATS & SOUND LEVELS

Refer to 2020 MSA SA National Motocross SSR's.

16. CLASSES AND TECHNICAL SPECIFICATIONS - Refer to SSR 3

16.1 <u>50cc Auto Clutch</u> 2 Stroke air & water cooled not exceeding 52cc.

Age – Open to riders from the year of their 4th birthday, to 31 December of the year in which their 9th birthday occurs.

<u>Please note</u> that the age for female competitors will be from the year of their 4th birthday, to 31 December of the year in which their 10th birthday occurs.

Carburettor size – 19mm as per the manufacturers specifications (stock).

Wheel diameter - not exceeding 10" (rear) and 12" (front).

16.2 <u>65cc (Clutch lever with gears – motorcycles not exceeding 65cc)</u>

Age – Open to riders from the year of their 7th birthday to 31 December of the year in which their 12th birthday occurs.

<u>Please note</u> that the age for female competitors will be from the year of their 7th birthday, to 31 December of the year in which their 13th birthday occurs.

Wheel diameter - not exceeding 12" (Rear) and 14" (front).

16.3 85cc (Clutch lever with gears – motorcycles not exceeding 85cc)

Age – Open to riders from the year of their 8th birthday to 31 December of the year in which their **15**th birthday occurs.

<u>Please note</u> that the age for female competitors will be from the year of their 8th birthday, to 31 December of the year in which their 16th birthday occurs.

Wheel diameter - not exceeding 17" (front) and 14" (rear) or 19" (front) and 16" (rear)

Will be bore and stroke to capacity only and no further restrictions will apply.

<u>Please note</u> that the age for 2021 will be amended – Open to riders from the year of the 9th birthday, to 31 December of the year in which their 14th birthday occurs.

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16.4 PREMIER CLASS A

Age applicable to bike size as per SR 16.6 and 16.7 - MX1, MX2, MX3, High School.

16.5 **PREMIER CLASS B**

Age applicable to bike size as per SR 16.6 and 16.7 – MX1, MX2, MX3, High School – CLUB LICENCED COMPETITORS ONLY.

16.6 **MX 3**

Age – Open to riders from the year of the riders 30th birthday.

Wheel Size - Rear 19" / 18" and Front 21"

Motorcycles of unrestricted capacity.

Please refer to 2020 MSA SA National Motocross SSR's.

16.7 **PREMIERE A AND B CLASSES** – Please refer to SR 16.5 and 16.6:

a) MX High School

Age – Open to riders from the year of their 13th birthday to 31 December of the year in which their 17th birthday occurs. Wheel size – Rear 19" / 18" and Front 21". Two stroke motorcycles not exceeding 126cc.

b) MX 2

Age – Open to riders from the year of their 15th birthday. Wheel size – Rear 19" / 18" and Front 21". 125cc -150cc 2 stroke & 250cc 4 stroke motorcycles.

c) MX 1

Age – Open to riders from the year of their 16th birthday. Wheel size – Rear 19" *I 18*" and Front 21". 125cc 2 stroke - 300cc 2Stroke & 250cc 4 stroke - 450cc 4 stroke motorcycles. Bonus points per heat for riders will be allocated as follows: - 2 bonus points for a MX3 rider participating in the MX 1 Class (from the year of the riders 30th birthday).

d) PLEASE NOTE - WINNERS FROM PREMIER B WILL MOVE TO PREMIER CLASS A THE FOLLOWING YEAR.

CLUB CLASSES WILL BE AS PER SR's ON RACE DAY

Unless otherwise stated, classes may be combined, but will score separately. Please also refer to Note 9 in the **2020** MSA SA National Motocross SSR's.

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
