2. **JURISDICTION:**

The FIM Africa MX OF AFRICAN NATIONS 2019 is held under the auspices of Motorsport Zimbabwe (MSZ) inconjunction with the promoter, Bogwheelers Club, and according to the FIM Africa Sporting Code, chapter 30 and FIM Africa MX Rules & Regulations 2019 [GCR's] covering Country Team Championship events for 2019.

4. <u>CLASSES</u>

Junior Classes: Senior Classes:

MX50cc: Riders aged 5 to 9 years

MX125 Riders aged 13 to 17 years

MX65cc: Riders aged 7 to 12 years

MX2: Riders aged 16 years & over

MX1: Riders aged 17 years & over

WMX: Riders aged 10 years and above on 85cc 2-stroke/150cc 4-stroke, and 13 years and above on 125cc

2-stroke motorcycles. Riders of 16 years and above may also compete on a 250cc 4-stroke motorcycle. Therefore, the Ladies Class will race as a combined age/capacity class, as one class. The Jury will decide if there are sufficient entries to divide the class into Lites & an Open class. The Jury has the right, in this instance, to alter the minimum number of starters required to constitute the class. Should there be insufficient entries to form a WMX Class the ladies must join the respective capacity class. However, the Ladies Trophy will be awarded based on points performance and the Jurys decision

N.B: Soon after entries close, the FMNs will be notified about the numbers in this class.

<u>Vets and Master Class (V&M MX)</u>: There will be 2 classes racing together.

Veterans: Riders aged 35 to 49. Masters Riders aged 50 years and older onwards, on any capacity motorcycle. Masters must produce proof of a medical Stress ECG report not older than 6 months. Vets and Master compete as a combined class but score separately. If there are insufficient minimum entries to form both classes, then 2 bonus points will be allocated to the master riders. These start line points will be added to the overall points for each heat.

Riders may participate in one class only.

Minimum Entries per Class: A minimum of 8 Riders and 6 Lady Riders at registration will constitute a Class.

5. AGE OF RIDERS

The minimum age begins on the 1st January of the year of the rider's birthday and maximum age is at the end of the calendar year during which the rider attains the maximum age.





6. **ENTRIES.**

For an entry to be valid, a completed official entry form must be submitted to Bogwheelers Club the FMNR by the closing date.

Entries open 1st July and close 1st August 2019 @ 1700 i.e. 4 weeks prior to the event.

Riders may only enter one class. Telephonic entries are not accepted

Entries received after the 31 July 2019 will not be included in the program.

- Riders Profiles & Photos to be sent no later than the 15th August 2019 for inclusion into the Race Programme.

NB – All competitors are required to submit a colour head and shoulder photograph as well as an action shot of themselves and their motorcycles with the **Riders Profile for publication in the event programme.**

7. LICENCES

Participation at this meeting is restricted to a valid **2019 FIM One Event MX Continental licence** [Cost Euro 105.00].

All licence applications are to be processed by the relevant FMN's via the **FIM Extranet**. Licences cannot be processed by the FIM Africa Secretariat. A Riders Licence List will be available on the FIM Extranet.

8. <u>COURSE AND VENUE:</u> DONNYBROOK Race Circuit, Arcturus Road, Harare. GPS S 17 49.54 E 31 10.97

9. <u>ELIGIBILITY OF RIDERS:</u>

Each country will be allowed to register up to 5 riders in each class for the Championship, designated as official riders in the championship by their Federation.

Riders must produce either a Passport or Resident's Permit as proof that they are eligible to compete for their country, with the approval of their FMN.

Countries are allowed to enter more than 5 riders in each class, but on the understanding that only the five designated riders entered, will be classified as official participants for the team results. If more than 8 countries enter countries MAY be asked to reduce team entries.

A bike that is presented at Technical inspection, as a spare bike for various nominated riders may be used in the applicable capacity classes, by another rider if so, approved by the Jury.

A minimum of 8 Riders and 6 WMX Riders at registration will constitute a Class.

All riders 50 years and older must provide proof of having passed a Stress ECG within the last 6 months.





NB: Medical Insurance with repatriation cover is included in your FIM Licence.

10. **COMPETITION NUMBERS:**

Refer to Art. 01.55 Of the Motocross Technical Rules. The only exception will be Art. 55.07 minimum dimensions of letters for MX 50cc class.

The font to be used for number plates on all 3 plates must be **Universal Bold only**.

Number plate colours:

All Junior Classes: - All numbers, sides and front: Black numbers on a White background
Senior Classes: - MX125 and MX1 Black numbers on a White background
MX2 White Numbers on a Black background

WMX standard bike colours or White on blue.
VMX standard bike colours or black on Yellow

11. RACE NUMBERS:

FIM Africa requires that all machines participating in the FIM Africa event display the FIM Africa approved logo on the top right or bottom corner of the front number plate, minimum size 35cm x 35 cm on a white background with black border. The organizer will supply stickers but sponsored riders can include logo on sticker kits if they are of approved size and colour.

13. FACILITIES FOR MACHINES AT CIRCUIT

Covered paddock facilities will be provided for visiting Teams.

Wash bays are available.

There is no vehicle or trailer parking in the paddock. These vehicles will be parked close to the paddock and will be guarded.

14. <u>ENTRY TO CIRCUIT</u>

Entrance is FREE for a (1) rider and a (1) mechanic provided they have the wrist band handed out at documentation. All other personnel will pay \$5.00 per adult and \$2.00 for children

15. DOCUMENTATION

Checking of licences, entries and general documentation will take place from **1200** to **1800** on **Friday 29**th **August 2019**, at the Donnybrook MX Track. **Team Managers only** are required to present their Teams documents. Refreshments will be available.

Documentation Schedule; Zimbabwe 1200. Zambia 1230. South Africa 1300. Uganda 1330. Botswana 1400. Kenya 1430. Morocco 1500. Other 1515.

16. TECHNICAL INSPECTION

All competitors bikes must be presented to the Technical Control, with their correct forms, bikes and kit for inspection.

Teams must present their bikes according to the following Schedule ONLY.

Zimbabwe 1330 Zambia 1430 South Africa 1500 Botswana 1545 Namibia 1615

Uganda 1640 Kenya 1700 North Africa and other Nations 1730

Each registered competitor must present their bike helmet & boots for Technical conformity. A sound test will be recorded by the Environment/Technical Steward. A spare silencer must be sound tested and sealed. It shall be marked and registered for use by the particular rider only.

Any countries spare team bike must be presented for checking along with the list of riders permitted to use the bike.

Any motorcycle that undergoes repairs during the course of the event may be subject to another Technical inspection, before continuing in the event, if so requested by the Technical Steward.

The decision of the Technical Steward will be final in all cases.

17. RIDERS BRIEFING:

Riders briefing will be held at the Start Line. All riders and the Jury members must be present at the briefing. Representatives may accompany the rider to the briefing. Failure to attend the riders briefing may result in a fine. After the briefing there will be a demonstration of the start procedure.





18. PRE RACE PADDOCK / WAITING ZONE:

The Pre-race paddock / Waiting Zone is in the Paddock. Riders bikes must be in the Waiting Zone a MINIMUM OF 10 minutes before the start of their heat. The waiting zone will be closed 10 minutes before the heat begins, riders not in the waiting zone 10 minutes before their heat will be excluded from that race.

Only MX50 riders may have a mechanic on the line.

19. RIDER START SELECTION:

The selection of starting positions will be done on Saturday after the second practice session in the Jury meeting tent. This will be done as per the FIM Africa MX of African Nations GCR's 2018 Art 10.4.

20. START PROCEDURE;

The Start of the race will be in accordance with the rules as per the FIM Africa MX 2018 GCR's **Art 13.3**. Starting blocks may be used by the Junior Classes and the Ladies. Competitors who do not take part in official practice must confirm their intention to start to the COC, no less than one hour before the start of the first heat.

21. **SIGNALLING:**

Red Flag - waved (Stop - Compulsory for everyone)

Black flag and a board with rider's number on it. Rider indicated to stop on the next lap at the Stop / Go Zone

Black flag and a board with rider's number on it. If telemetry is used, and timed penalty is being applied, the rider will be shown the black flag and the penalty board with the applied penalty being displayed in seconds, but will not be required to stop

Should the penalty board display an X instead of seconds, the rider must stop at the Stop / Go Zone on the following lap.

Yellow flag – held stationary - Danger, ride slowly, no overtaking and maintain position no jumping

Yellow flag – waved - Immediate danger, prepare to stop. Failure to observe this flag may result in

a penalty or exclusion. CoC will have final say in a protest.

Green Flag - Course clear.

Chequered Flag - End of Practice or Race.

White Flag/Red Cross - Medical personnel required or on circuit. Exercise extreme caution.

22. END OF THE RACE:

The waving of the chequered flag will signify the end of each race.

The Jury President/COC reserves the right to impound and examine any motorcycle at their discretion.

23. NOTICE BOARD:

The official notice board is situated at the entry to the <u>waiting zone</u>. It is an offence to remove race results from this board.

24. RESULTS:

Notwithstanding the general protest period laid down by the FIM Africa, the protest period for motocross will be 30 minutes from actual posting of the FINAL results on the notice board.

Additional Race result copies may be obtained from the Chief Time keeper.

25. <u>POSTPONEMENT, ABANDONMENT OR CANCELLATION:</u>

The Organisers reserve the right to postpone, abandon or cancel the meeting or any part thereof. In the event of any of the above, the Competitor/Entrant has no right to claim against the Promoter/Organiser in respect of any loss or damage he/she may have incurred. The meeting will not be postponed, abandoned or cancelled without the consent of the Jury President.

26. <u>FUEL:</u>

As per the 2018 FIM Africa MX GCR's Art 18.4

The use of methanol is not permitted





27. POINTS:

Points will be awarded to riders in each FIM Africa MXOAN race according to the following scale:

20 points – 1 st	10 points – 6 th	5 points – 11 th
17 points – 2 nd	9 points – 7 th	4 points – 12 th
15 points – 3 rd	8 points – 8 th	3 points – 13 th
13 points – 4 th	7 points – 9 th	2 points – 14 th
11 points – 5 th	6 points – 10 th	1 points – 15 th

The final Team Results will be established as follows:

The winning Team is the one which has gained the highest total of points after having added the **two** best results of the **nominated** Team Riders in the respective classes using the actual race results from each heat race.

In the event of a Tie, the number of better placings will be taken into account. If a Tie still exists the points scored in the last heat will determine the order of the final points standings.

Overall Individual Class winners [1st, 2nd, & 3rd] will be required to attend the podium immediately after their final heat for a presentation ceremony.

There will be **NO** individual class ceremonies performed at the Main Prize Giving.

28. PROTESTS:

All protests must be submitted and signed only by the person directly concerned. Each protest must refer to a single subject only and must be presented within 30 minutes of the publication of the results, unless otherwise provided in the Appendices of the Sporting Code. During a meeting, protests must be submitted according to the provisions of the Supplementary Regulations and to an official in charge,

(Clerk of the Course, Secretary of the meeting).

Protest Fee U\$\$ 100.00
Protest entailing dismantling a machine – additional U\$\$ 100.00
Protest entailing fuel control U\$\$ 100.00

The losing party is liable for all costs in any protest should the protestor's protest be upheld. These costs will be determined by the Jury of the Meeting.

29. <u>CLOSURE OF CIRCUIT:</u>

The MX track will be closed at 1800 Friday 16 August 2019.

30. TRANSPONDERS:

Transponders will be used to record all race results.

Each rider will be issued a transponder after paying a \$10 fee. Should a rider lose the original transponder a replacement will be issued upon a further deposit of \$10. If a rider loses the transponder during the race the rider will be deemed as a DNF.

31. ENVIRONMENT

The FIM Africa Environmental code has been adopted by the MSZ and its member clubs. This Code will be strictly enforced at this event. Riders are to ensure that they use their enviro mat and place your oils & fluids in the appropriately Labeled receptacle. Place your rubbish in the bins provided.

32. ANTI-DOPING CODE

MSZ and FIM AFRICA subscribes to the provisions of the World Anti-Doping Authority (WADA) and as such all competitors are bound by WADA rules and regulations, in respect of performance enhancing and use of banned substances during this MXOAN event. Random dope testing may be conducted from time to time as directed by WADA (RADO IN Africa), and all competitors must comply if selected. Any competitor taking any drug for therapeutic purposes, such as asthma, hay fever, ADD, etc. and which contains substances that are included on the WADA prohibited list, must obtain a Therapeutic Use Exemption, prior to entering this competition and submit with their entry at Official Documentation.
